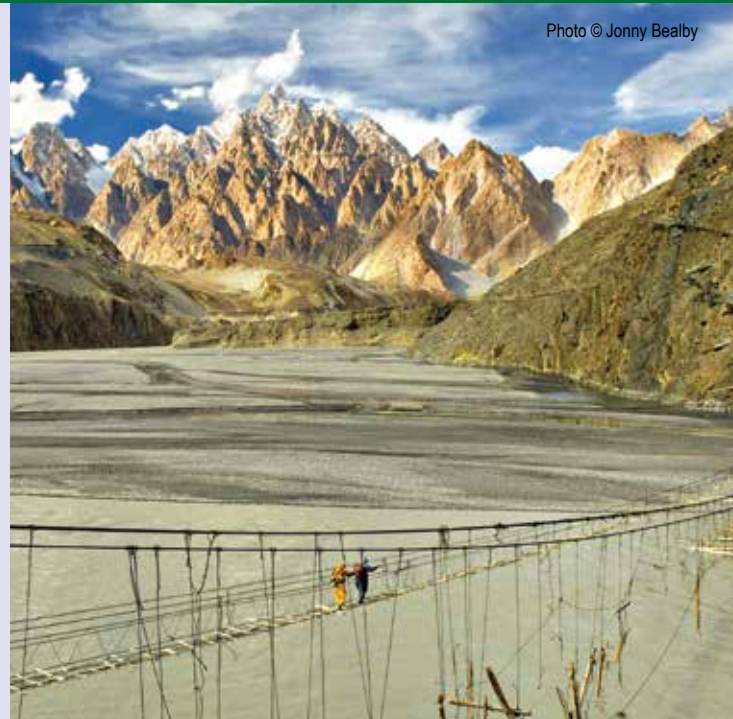
Meetings
