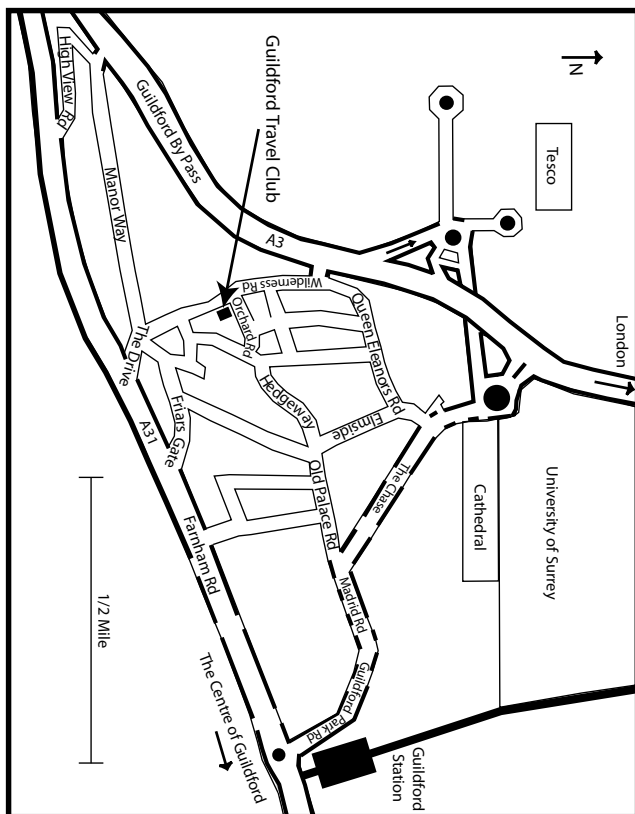


Onslow Village Hall is at the junction of
